

Alba: Fenoglio's Tanaro

From Fenoglio's works you can trace his strong personal connection to the river Tanaro. It was a refuge from the adversity of the world, which never failed to inspire him. Even today it inspires visitors that are curious to discover the unspoilt nature of this legendary part of the Langhe and the Roero. One can walk along the path that joins the town with the riverbank and runs underneath the spectacular precipices of the Barbaresco rockfaces.



Starting point: Piazza Monsignor Grassi. From here you follow the road towards Barbaresco until you come to a level crossing. Turn left here and after about 200 metres of asphalt road take the path that leads up to the Altavilla hill. Once you have reached the crest of the hill, carry on to Cascina Ghersi. From here you carry on through the fields until you reach a path that goes through the woods and descends down to the confluence of the Seno d'Elvio River with the River Tanaro. From here you carry on through the territory of Barbaresco along the path that crosses the Tanaro floodplain. From here you carry on through the territory of Barbaresco along the path that crosses the Tanaro floodplain, till you reach the asphalt road to Barbaresco village.
