

La Morra - Barolo -Castiglione Falletto

This route takes you through a natural amphitheatre of gentle vineyard covered hills. It offers picturesque scenes with magical colours and strong contrasts. It is an opportunity to come into close contact with nature and also the ideal occasion to sample some excellent Barolo wines.





Information

- Length of the route: 8.6 Km
- Duration: 2 hours, 45 minutes
- Starting point: La Morra
- Arrival point: Castiglione Falletto
- Recommended season: spring, summer
- Difficulty: 2
- Signs: red and white horizontal stripes



Starting point: piazza Belvedere in La Morra, which offers spectacular panoramic views across all of the Langhe. Head off in the direction of the Cantina Comunale and the town Church, turn left along the bastions and continue on until you reach the main road. Turn left and then after 200 m turn left again and follow the partially asphalt road up to Cerequio. Go down to the right and then to the left across the vineyards and past Cascina Marenda and Cascina Sarmassa. Then go up the asphalt road until you reach via Bergeisa and carry on towards the village of San Lorenzo. Then take the country road to Barolo.

Just after the castle of Barolo, take the road that descends sharply and follow it until you get to Aie Sottane, continue straight ahead along a dirt road. After about 600 m turn right over the bridge and follow the path for 100 m, then turn left and

follow alongside the stream; this takes you up to a dirt road. At the end of this road, take a right and go up to the summit of the hill. After a brief descent, which takes you to an asphalt road, turn right and then after about 80 m turn left onto a dirt road that leads through poplar woods.

When you reach a crossroads with another dirt road turn right and go up through an expanse of vineyards until you reach Castiglione Falletto.
